Action Taken Report for the Academic Session 2018-2019

 In response to valuable student feedback, the college administration has proactively initiated measures to enhance the quality, variety, and accessibility of food offerings in the canteen. Recognizing that many students commute long distances and spend extended hours on campus, the canteen plays a crucial role in providing them with meals tailored to their tastes and nutritional requirements.

- The college has introduced add-on courses from this session aimed at enhancing students' versatility for diverse career paths. Crafted with precision, these courses bridge the gap between theory and practice, significantly boosting students' employability in specific sectors. This strategic initiative underscores the college's commitment to providing a well-rounded and practically relevant education, preparing students for success in various professional domains.
- The Women's Cell at the college organized a profound and impactful gender sensitization programme focusing on the critical issue of 'Abuse of Girl Children in the Family.' Recognizing the urgency and gravity of addressing this societal concern, the Women's Cell undertook the responsibility of creating awareness and fostering sensitivity among the college community. The initiative aimed to dismantle societal taboos and initiate a dialogue that encourages openness, understanding, and support, ensuring gender equity.
- The NSS units of the college orchestrated a series of impactful programs to commemorate significant events such as Independence Day, Yoga Day, a Blood Donation Camp, and 'Swachhta Hi Seva.' These observances serve as more than mere rituals; they are strategic initiatives that foster a sense of patriotism, health consciousness, community service, and cleanliness. Through these programs, students actively engage in activities that contribute to the holistic development of both individuals and the community, aligning with the college's commitment to instilling values and social responsibility.
- The Department of History at the college convened a seminar to commemorate the 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. This event was driven by the profound motivation to honour the legacy and teachings of the iconic leader who played a pivotal role in India's independence. The seminar aimed to delve into Gandhi's philosophy, principles, and his enduring impact on history, serving as both a tribute and an educational platform for students and faculty to reflect on his timeless contributions.

Action Taken Report for the Academic Session 2019-2020

 In response to the unprecedented challenges posed by the closure of academic institutions due to the COVID-19 pandemic, our college swiftly transitioned to online teaching, learning, and evaluation processes. Led by the IQAC and Teachers' Council, the college organized a targeted capacity-building programme to enhance faculty members' proficiency in online teaching, specifically utilizing Google Meet. The objective was to ensure a seamless shift to online education, providing students with continuous classes and essential study materials during these challenging times. Additionally, faculty members are now uploading study materials on the college website for easy student access, facilitating remote learning.

- Amid the economic challenges of the pandemic, numerous college students from impoverished backgrounds found themselves compelled to assist their families financially. Daytime employment became essential due to their parents' job losses due to the pandemic-induced economic downturn. In response to students' requests, online classes were thoughtfully scheduled beyond regular hours, including evening classes, ensuring accessibility and flexibility for those balancing work commitments.
- Under the adept guidance of technically proficient faculty members and non-teaching staff, the college has successfully developed an online portal for conducting and managing internal tests and semester-end university examinations. Students were provided counseling on effectively navigating this portal during examination periods.

Action Taken Report for the Academic Session 2020-2021

- To satiate students' academic curiosity and quench their thirst for knowledge, the college's Departments of English and Bengali organized special lecture sessions featuring eminent speakers from other reputable institutions.
- This session witnessed dynamic initiatives from various departments. The Department of Economics hosted a National Level online Essay Writing Competition focusing on the economic impact of the government's lockdown announcement. Simultaneously, the Department of English organized a National Webinar on Cross-Cultural Perspectives of the Renaissance. Additionally, the Department of Geography orchestrated Quiz competitions and a State Level webinar on Climate Change and Sustainability. These events garnered enthusiastic participation from a large number of students, reflecting the vibrant engagement and interest within the college community.
- This session, the college has introduced additional Add-on courses to enhance students' versatility and adaptability across diverse career paths. These courses aim to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and real-world applications, significantly boosting students' employability in specific sectors.
- In response to student demand for career guidance and future job prospects, the college's Career Counseling and Placement Cell, in collaboration with IQAC and NSS units, conducted seminars. These sessions aimed to enlighten students about diverse career options and hosted workshops to enhance

their skills, focusing on proficient usage of Microsoft Word for business communications, ensuring industry readiness.

- The college's NSS units organized workshops to alleviate students' mental stress and conducted online yoga sessions, fostering both physical and mental well-being during the challenging pandemic period. The NSS units spearheaded a crucial initiative by hosting an online workshop featuring a doctor, creating awareness among students about the causes and transmission of the contagious COVID-19 virus. Emphasizing the significance of adhering to COVID protocols, the session aimed to empower students in playing a proactive role in curbing the spread of the disease. These initiatives are a testament to our commitment to the holistic development of our students.
- The college's NSS units, in collaboration with the Teachers' Council, observed International Mother Language Day, fostering linguistic and cultural diversity among students. The initiative aimed to underscore the significance of preserving and respecting one's mother tongue, contributing to a more inclusive and enriched educational environment.
- The IQAC has recommended that for overall development and job readiness of the students the college should start add-on courses in different subjects.
- The IQAC has also advised the college to start collaborative teaching-learning & research initiatives through signing MoUs, linkages and such agreements with other colleges and academic institutions.

Action Taken Report for the Academic Session 2021-2022

- To address students' needs, the college authority decided to allocate funds to procure textbooks in Bengali version for various departments, facilitating enhanced learning. Furthermore, the decision to increase the number of mentoring classes demonstrates the commitment to providing special attention to the slow learners.
- The college has made the strategic decision to organize industry visits for students, providing first hand exposure to industry ambiance and the intricacies of various job roles within a professional setup. This

industry-academia collaboration aims to equip students with practical insights and prepare them for the demands of the professional world.

- The NSS units orchestrated impactful events, including an AIDS Awareness Camp, Blood Donation Camp, Eye Check-up, and Thalassemia Test within the college premises. Beyond raising health awareness, these initiatives instill a sense of social responsibility among students, contributing to the collective effort in building a better society.
- In response to student feedback on cleanliness issues in the girls' toilets, the college administration has directed the janitorial staff to diligently clean and disinfect these facilities regularly using phenyl and germ-killing agents. This proactive measure aims to ensure enhanced hygiene for the female students of the college.
- The college recently hosted a State Level Webinar on Gender Sensitization and observed International Women's Day, led by the college's Women Cell, to raise awareness about women's rights. Additionally, the Research and Development Cell and IQAC organized a webinar on Intellectual Property Rights in association with NIPM & IPO Kolkata. This initiative is expected to equip students with valuable skills, fostering innovation, ethical conduct, and legal literacy crucial for success in academic and professional pursuits.
- The Magazine sub-committee successfully revived the college magazine, "Anwesha," for the academic year 2021-22. Despite its historical presence, the magazine had faced a hiatus of two years due to disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Notably, this academic year marked a digital transformation for "Anwesha," ensuring a broader readership. The magazine, known for its multidisciplinary and multilingual content, received over 150 contributions from various stakeholders of the college. It served as a platform for students to express their thoughts, hopes, emotions, aspirations, and convictions. This creative outlet contributes to the holistic development of their minds, fostering their psychological, intellectual, and cognitive growth.
- On the basis of the recommendation of IQAC, the college has started add-on courses in different subjects for overall development and job readiness of the students.
- The college has successfully signed academic linkages with some colleges.

Action Taken Report for the Academic Session 2022-2023

- The college has decided to sign Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) with other academic institutions and significant progress has been made in this initiative during the current academic session. These agreements pave the way for exchange of faculty members, enabling the sharing of invaluable expertise, teaching methodologies, and research findings. Moreover, the MOUs unlock access to specialized resources, including libraries, laboratories, and research facilities at partner institutions, providing students with unique opportunities beyond the confines of their home campus. This strategic decision promises to elevate the educational experience and broaden the horizons of both faculty and students alike.
- The college's IQAC has launched an innovative program titled 'Talk of the Month.' In this series, a faculty member delivers an enlightening lecture monthly, addressing a wide array of subjects and relevant national or global issues. The audience includes faculty members, non-teaching staff, and students. The speakers strive to present engaging and thought-provoking content, distilling complex topics into accessible narratives. The overwhelming participation of students has transformed this initiative into a resounding success. Beyond broadening their knowledge, the 'Talk of the Month' series serves as a catalyst for igniting the creative minds of students.
- The Teachers' Council, in collaboration with the NSS units of the college, orchestrated a dynamic 'Students' Week' in adherence to government directives. This initiative aimed to enlighten students on crucial topics, not only advancing their academic pursuits but also aiding in charting diverse career paths. The week featured various events, providing a platform for students to showcase their hidden talents. Key highlights included an awareness program on initiatives such as the Students' Credit Card and scholarships like Kanyashree, Oikyashree, Swami Vivekananda Merit cum Means scholarships. Additionally, students participated in a Drawing and Poster Competition, learned about embracing Photography and Mass-Media as a career option, and engaged in cultural programmes including singing, dancing, recitation, drama, and mime shows.
- The college's IQAC and Career Counseling & Placement Cell joined forces to conduct a targeted Skill Development Workshop for final semester students. This workshop aimed to equip them with practical knowledge in Microsoft Office, Internet of Things, and enhance their communication and oratory skills. With a focus on making them industry-ready, this workshop stands as a testament to the college's commitment to nurturing holistic and employable skill sets, ensuring students embark on their professional journeys with confidence and competence.
- The college solemnly observed the 'Partition Horrors Remembrance Day,' or 'Vibhajan Vibhishika Smriti Diwas,' on August 14. Recently announced by the Prime Minister, this day serves as a poignant tribute to those who lost their lives and were displaced during the nation's partition. The event aimed to enlighten

students about this historical tragedy, fostering a sense of unity, social harmony, and human empowerment. By commemorating this day, the college seeks to eliminate discrimination, enmity, and ill-will, emphasizing the importance of understanding and embracing our shared history for a harmonious future.

- The Department of Political Science, in collaboration with the IQAC, organized an impactful state-level seminar. This seminar's focus was cultivating awareness among students about the Fundamental Rights enshrined in the Indian Constitution. The event served as a platform to educate, empower, and inspire students to become informed, responsible, and active citizens and instill a sense of civic duty that contributes positively to the democratic ethos of the nation.
- In a collaborative effort, the Department of Sociology, in association with the IQAC and R&D Cell of the college, conducted a state-level workshop. This workshop brought together students and faculty members to gain insights into understanding the curriculum structure of undergraduate courses in alignment with the New Education Policy. An eminent expert from a reputed educational institution shared expertise on this critical subject. The event addressed student concerns regarding subject choices, internships, and adapting to the evolving curricular landscape. It provided a valuable platform for dialogue, guidance, and resolution in navigating the challenges presented by the new educational paradigm.
- The college has taken a proactive step by creating a digital data bank of online semester-end university question papers for all subjects from the past two years. Housed on the librarian's computer, this resource is easily accessible to students and faculty members. Recognizing the significance of widespread availability, the college is soon set to upload the question bank on its website, ensuring that individuals can access it anytime, from anywhere. This initiative aims to enhance accessibility, facilitate academic preparation, and streamline the examination process for the college community.
- The college enthusiastically engaged in the Ministry of Education's flagship initiative, the DigiLocker National Academic Depository, a pioneering effort by the Government of India. This initiative establishes a secure 24x7 online depository for the academic awards of our students. Aligned with the objectives of the National Education Policy 2020, this academic credit bank is designed to facilitate seamless academic mobility for students. It empowers them with the flexibility to pursue their studies across various Higher Education Institutions in the nation, incorporating an efficient 'credit transfer' mechanism.
- In a spectacular showcase of talent and sportsmanship, the Sports and Cultural sub-committees collaborated to present the Annual Sports and Cultural Competition for the current academic session. The event featured a diverse range of activities, including indoor Chess and Carrom competitions, and exhilarating outdoor events like the hundred meters, two hundred meters, and four hundred meters run,

long jump, shot put, spoon and marble race, and the engaging musical chair. Simultaneously, the cultural competition unfolded with events such as Rabindra Sangeet, Dance, Extempore, Debate, Essay Writing, Painting, and a Quiz competition. The overwhelming participation of both male and female students elevated the competition to a grand success. As a fitting culmination, all winners received well-deserved medals and certificates, acknowledging their outstanding achievements in this dynamic fusion of sports and culture.

- The IQAC has recommended the college to undertake quality audit initiatives such as ISO certification in near future.
- A number of MoUs and linkages have been signed with other colleges.
- Add-on courses have multiplied in number and are running successfully.

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
